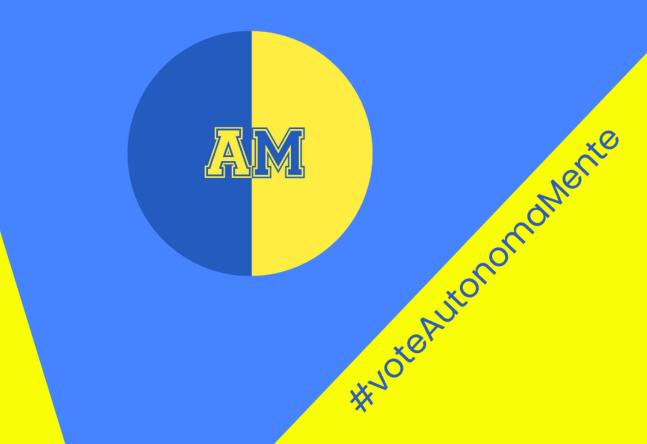

General Electoral Program



Education Education

- Mandatory lecture recordings: we request that the Academic Senate maintain the obligation to record lectures for at least the next academic year.
- 2. Elimination of paper forms for student procedures: to streamline student's administrative processes, we propose eliminating paper forms (e.g., for study plans) in favor of full digitalization.
- 3. Tracking system for student requests: we propose introducing a university-wide system that allows students to monitor the progress and status of their requests and procedures in real time.
- Documentation in English: considering the growing number of international students, we strongly advocate for all official websites and documents to be available in English.
- 5. Internship list enhancement: we propose updating the internship listings to include more detailed information such as contact details, specific locations, and available roles.
- 6. Transport discounts for off-campus Internships: we propose offering transport discounts for students who must travel to cities different from their main campus for curricular internships.
- Expanded course satisfaction surveys: we suggest enhancing course evaluation surveys with questions on practical matters like exam scheduling on Esse3, to better assess course organization.
- 8. **Improved post-exam surveys:** to ensure exams align with the course

content and declared learning outcomes, we propose improving postexam evaluation forms.

- 9. Traineeship information sessions: we want to organize informative events that explain the Erasmus Traineeship program and its benefits in a clear and engaging way.
- 10. Language courses for outgoing Erasmus students: we propose offering short language optional courses tailored to different Erasmus destinations (in collaboration with CLA) to help students prepare for their experience abroad.
- 11. Better Integration of Digital Platforms: we aim to integrate the university's educational tools and platforms to reduce information fragmentation and improve user experience.
- 12. Free access courses (e.g., English and IT): we propose offering free, online English and basic IT courses through the Digital Education Hub for all university students
- Custom classroom requirements: we suggest enabling instructors to request specific classroom features (e.g., chalkboards, projectors, group work setup) during the scheduling process.
- 14. Inclusion of tutoring hours in the timetable: we request that tutoring and exercise sessions be clearly included in class schedules from the beginning of the semester to improve planning.
- 15. 60-CFU Teaching Qualification Path Info Session: we propose organizing informational sessions on the new 60-CFU teaching qualification track to

explain how it works and how to access it.

- 16. Income-Based access to 60-CFU program: we propose implementing a tuition fee structure for the 60-CFU pathway based on students' ISEE (family income declaration), to ensure equitable access.
- 17. University-wide research fair: we propose organizing a university-wide research fair to showcase research projects and facilitate thesis opportunities and networking.
- Remote learning in case of transport strikes: we request that students be allowed to attend classes remotely during public transport strikes or emergencies.
- Standardizing partial exam regulations: We propose implementing clear and shared guidelines across the university for organizing partial exams during teaching periods.



Facilities & Sustainability

- 20. **Expanding green areas:** we propose increasing green spaces on the Piazzale Europa campus and satellite campuses, as they support both environmental and mental wellbeing.
- 21. Sustainable materials in renovations: we encourage the use of sustainable materials, such as anti-smog paints, for indoor and outdoor renovation works.
- 22. Water fountains in every building: we request that at least one water fountain be installed in every university building.
- 23. **Bike racks:** To support sustainable mobility, we propose installing additional bike racks at both central and satellite campuses.
- 24. Enhanced book-crossing spaces: we suggest expanding and improving book-crossing zones by adding seating and proper lighting to encourage reading and knowledge sharing.
- 25. **Dedicated lunchrooms:** we propose assigning at least one lunch-friendly room per building to accommodate students during mealtimes.
- 26. **Outdoor gyms:** we propose installing outdoor fitness equipment on the Piazzale Europa campus to promote physical wellness.
- 27. **Smart Signage:** we propose replacing outdated signage with remotecontrolled, digital signs that can be easily updated.
- 28. Electrical outlets in all classrooms: we request the installation of power outlets in all classrooms to support the use of

digital devices during lessons.

- 29. Multilingual campus signage: we propose translating campus signage into English to assist international students.
- 30. **Building floor maps:** we propose posting floor-by-floor maps in all university buildings (initially physical, then digital) for easier navigation.
- 31. Oudoor bouldering wall: we propose building a bouldering wall within the university to offer an alternative outdoor physical activity option.
- 32. Microwaves and kettles in every building: we request the installation of at least one microwave and kettle per building to support students during meal breaks.
- 33. Student involvement in accessibility planning (PEBA): we propose involving students in both the planning and monitoring phases of the university's Accessibility Plan (PEBA).
- 34. **Recreational areas in Gorizia:** we propose installing outdoor ping pong tables and indoor foosball tables in underused areas of the Gorizia campus.
- 35. **Comfortable green spaces:** we suggest adding deck chairs or loungers in green areas to make them more usable and inviting.

<u>Welfare &</u> Student Rights

- 36. Maintain no-tax area at €30,000: we support preserving the current no-tax threshold to ensure that higher education remains accessible to all.
- 37. Lower tuition for master's students: to encourage enrollment in local graduate programs, we propose tuition reductions for students continuing at UniTS after earning their bachelor's degree.
- 38. Inclusive alias careers policy: we advocate for expanding the alias career system by removing the requirement for medical transition, making it more accessible.
- 39. Creation of a UniTS alumni association: we propose establishing a central alumni network to help current students connect with graduates and explore career paths.
- 40. **Reopening of Gorizia campus bar:** we support reactivating the former bar space in the Gorizia campus as a refreshment and social zone.
- 41. More agreements with language schools: we propose increasing agreements with external language schools and certifying institutions since the CLA currently does not issue certifications.
- 42. Bank account setup during enrollment: we request that students be given the option to open a free bank account during enrollment, to receive scholarships and reimbursements.
- 43. More Student Discounts & Partnerships:

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we propose expanding university partnerships for both cultural and recreational discounts.

- 44. **Team Registry (Albo dei Team):** we propose creating an official registry of student teams to recognize and support their activities, including visibility on the university website.
- 45. Awareness Events for the 175-Hour Scholarship: we propose holding info sessions with testimonials from past recipients to explain how the 175-hour scholarship program works.
- 46. Indicate preferred fields in 175-Hour applications: we suggest allowing students to indicate their preferred fields of work within the 175-hour program application.
- 47. **Improved printing services:** we request enabling students to top up printing credits and ensuring equal access to printing services across all campuses.
- 48. Extension of 175-Hour collaborations: we propose allowing departments to extend student collaborations for a limited number of hours if agreed upon.
- 49. **ARDIS scholarship call in English:** we advocate for translating the ARDIS grant call into English to support international students.
- 50. Alias careers in ARDIS: we support the implementation of alias careers within ARDIS to ensure consistency in student rights.
- 51. Special needs section in housing applications: we propose adding a

section in student housing applications to express personal needs and circumstances.

- 52. Earlier scholarship rankings for freshmen: we propose aligning the release of scholarship rankings with the start of classes to support new students from day one.
- 53. **Extended kitchen hours in student housing:** we request longer kitchen hours in student housing to accommodate different student schedules.
- 54. More diverse cafeteria options: we propose expanding cafeteria food choices, such as reintroducing the beloved chicken dish.
- 55. Instructional video guides: we propose creating short, clear video tutorials explaining key university processes (e.g., study plan submission).
- 56. Centralized psychological support role: we want to establish an institutional figure responsible for student psychological wellbeing, accessible and student focused.
- 57. Faculty training on student wellbeing: we propose organizing wellbeing awareness sessions for faculty members, through the Teaching and Learning Center.
- 58. Visibility for student protection figures: we propose posting contact info for student protection roles (ombudsman, trusted advisor) on a dedicated university-wide board.

- 59. **Digital accessibility:** we request all university websites and platforms include features such as audio guidance, adjustable font spacing, and other accessibility tools.
- 60. First aid courses: we propose offering low-cost (or free) first aid courses for students, promoting health and safety on campus.
- 61. Improved transportation in Gorizia: we support enhancing shuttle service between Gorizia's train station and campus, especially during high-traffic periods.

- 62. Call for applications for the study and sport programme: we request the establishment of a call for applications, with all the information needed to apply for admission to the study and sport programme, such as timelines and the criteria for assessing applications.
- 63. Fee reductions: we ask that objective criteria be established to be able to access fee reductions for top student athletes.
- 64. Number of student athletes: we request that the number of students eligible for the study and sport programme be increased.
- 65. Recognition of student athlete status: we request that there be formal recognition of student athlete status.
- 66. Discounted membership for ARDiS grant recipients: we request reduced (or free) CUS membership fees for students receiving ARDiS financial aid.
- 67. New CUS agreements: we propose the creation of new partnerships between CUS and regional organizations.
- 68. Free self-defense courses: we request the introduction of free self-defense courses.
- 69. Sports course satisfaction surveys: we propose regular surveys to evaluate sports courses, including feedback on training schedules.

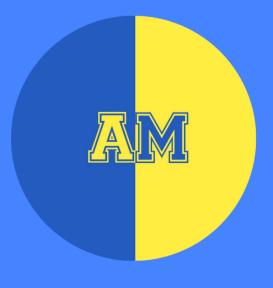
