SUBMISSION DEADLINE: 23rd March 2026 at 12:00 (CET)

The contents of this call are to be considered indicative. Erasmus funding is subject to the results of the 2026 Call and the subsequent signing of the Agreement between the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE and the University of Trieste.

Participation in the call and any Erasmus funding are always subject to the actual availability of funds from the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE. The University cannot be held responsible if funding is reduced or withdrawn. Any changes or additions to the activities and funding provided under this call will be communicated in a timely manner and published on the Double and Joint Degree 2026-2027 call webpage. In the absence of updates, this call shall remain valid.

All activities related to the mobility period covered by this call must end by 31st October 2027.

All information and official documents relating to this call for applications, including the list of possible destinations, the official guidelines and forms, any updates and deadlines, are available on the [Double and Joint Degree 2026-2027 call webpage](#).

This call may be reopened with new destinations or updates, which will be promptly communicated through the official University channels.

FOREWORD

The Double Degree Agreements concluded by the University of Trieste with foreign universities offer regularly enrolled students the opportunity to undertake an international study experience and obtain, at the end of their studies, two separate degrees: one issued by the University of Trieste and the other by the partner university.

The Joint Degree Agreements signed by the University of Trieste with foreign universities offer regularly enrolled students the opportunity to follow a programme that has been designed jointly by the involved parties and obtain, at the end of their studies, a joint degree issued by the University of Trieste and the partner universities.

Examinations and activities carried out abroad will be validated provided that they are scheduled in the Learning Agreement, i.e., the document that defines the study programme to be followed during the period of study abroad.

If the relevant double or joint agreement so provides, students may also include research for their thesis and/or other educational activities in their Learning Agreement.

Admission requirements are laid down in each double or joint degree agreement (see Annex A). Interested students should pay particular attention to any restrictions applying to their selected destination as only students enrolled in the degree programme indicated in Annex A are eligible.

If a given agreement is yet to be defined or renewed, the information will be specified in the 'Type of Agreement' section of the relevant sheet in Annex A. Mobility periods will only be guaranteed once the new agreement or renewal is signed.

ARTICLE 1 – REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

Requirements for admission vary depending on the individual double or joint degree agreement and on the relevant funding.

1.1 General requirements

All applicants must meet the following requirements:

- 1) be enrolled at the University from the submission of their application to the end of their mobility period (without any interruptions);
- 2) be enrolled at the University for the academic year 2026-2027, at the time of departure and for the entire duration of the mobility period;
- 3) be enrolled in one of the UniTS degree programmes indicated in the agreement with their selected destination for the whole of their mobility period;



1.2 Specific requirements for destinations funded through Erasmus+

The Erasmus+ programme sets limits on the duration of physical mobility periods. Students wishing to obtain a double or joint degree at a destination funded by the Erasmus+ programme must comply with the admission requirements laid down in paragraph 1.1 as well as with the maximum Erasmus+ monthly duration per degree cycle, regardless of the type of mobility (internship or study).

- **min 2 months** (60 days)
- **max 12 months** for each degree cycle
- **up to 24 months** for integrated master's degrees.

These mobility quotas are also valid for Erasmus+ periods spent abroad while enrolled at another university.

For the purpose of calculating the duration of mobility, a month is equal to 30 days, in accordance with the Erasmus+ Programme definition.

By submitting their application, candidates **declare that their proposed mobility period will not exceed the mobility limits** set for their degree cycle.

1.3 Specific requirements for destinations funded through ministerial funds

Students wishing to obtain a double or joint degree at a destination funded by the Italian Ministry must comply with the admission requirements laid down in paragraph 1.1 as well as with the following requirements:

- be on track to complete their UniTS degree programme within the usual time frame or within one supplementary year.
- obtaining at least 1 ECTS abroad during their mobility period.

1.4 Compliance with the requirements of the call

Applications are subject to compliance with all the requirements and constraints of this call, irrespective of the article in which they are detailed.

1.5 Verification of requirements

The University may verify compliance with requirements at any stage of the procedure.

Candidates who fail to meet these requirements may be excluded from the selection at any stage of the procedure, even after the publication of the list of successful candidates.

Should the University find that a candidate fails to meet the requirements, even after allocation of the grant, any financial contribution will be forfeit and the candidate will have to reimburse any instalments already received.



ARTICLE 2 – FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

This Article regulates the payment of financial contributions to selected students, including:

- basic mobility grant;
- additional funding;
- additional funding for disadvantaged students who fall into the categories indicated in the call;
- reimbursement of travel costs in accordance with the 2026 Erasmus+ scheme.

Contributions are subject to availability of financial resources and to the terms and conditions laid down in this call. They will be paid only to regularly enrolled students who will be selected through the procedure established in this call.

- The financial contribution is calculated on the basis of the final, confirmed duration of the mobility. The maximum duration is indicated in the financial agreement signed by the student before the beginning of their mobility period. The total amount of the grant is calculated on the basis that a month equals 30 days. Mobility periods shorter than a month will be calculated proportionately by multiplying the number of actual days by 1/30 of the monthly amount.
- In the case that the mobility period becomes more than five days shorter than that established in the financial agreement, the contribution will be recalculated on the basis of the actual days spent abroad.
- No financial contribution will be given for time spent abroad beyond the maximum duration of the mobility period established in the individual double or joint degree agreement.
- No financial contribution will be given for time spent abroad beyond the maximum duration of the mobility period established in the financial agreement.

Procedures and amounts indicated for mobility grants, disadvantaged student allowances and the reimbursement of travel expenses are based on the information available at the date of publication of this call.

These provisions may be updated or amended in accordance with any national and European Erasmus+ regulations and guidelines for the year 2026 that should be issued after publication.

Any updates will be automatically applied to the selected students and communicated through publication on the University website and/or through institutional communications.



2.1 Exclusion for cumulation with other funding

Candidates must declare if they receive other forms of financial support from national or European bodies, be they public or private, for the same period of mobility. The International Mobility Office will check whether this is compatible with the Erasmus+ grant.

In any case, the Erasmus+ grant cannot be cumulated with other EU grants or funding for the same period and for the same purposes. Participation under the Erasmus+ mobility scheme in activities that are already funded or co-financed by other EU programmes (e.g. ESF) are not allowed.

2.2 Selection procedure

Grants are subject to availability of funds. In case of insufficient financial resources, the University may establish a limit on the maximum duration of grants.

In the case of destinations financed through the Erasmus+ programme, students with grants covering a limited period may complete their mobility in 'zero grant' mode, thus keeping their Erasmus student status till the end of their mobility period.

2.3 Payment methods

Payments will be made exclusively by bank transfer to **the recipient's bank account** or to **a joint account in the recipient's name**. Bank account details must be entered in the online academic services portal (Esse3). When filling in their application, candidates must verify that their bank details are correct and must ensure that they are updated in a timely manner.

2.4 Basic mobility grant

The selected candidates receive a mobility grant. The monthly allowance is proportional to the length of the mobility period and varies according to the destination country.

The amounts of the mobility grant and the list of countries below may vary on the basis of new national provisions not known at the time of publication of this call.

If the University of Trieste and the host university signed an Erasmus+ agreement, the mobility grant will be funded by Italy's national Erasmus+ agency, INDIRE. In other cases, funding will be provided by ministerial funds. Please remember that ministerial funds are also subject to the requirements laid down in Article 1(1.3).

In the case of grants funded by the Italian Ministry, if a student returns from mobility without obtaining the required credits or without having carried out the planned activity, they will be required to repay the full basic grant received. This does not apply if the student can provide documentation attesting to exceptional circumstances, which has been verified by the University as being in line with the relevant funding programme's regulations.

2.5 Contribution for disadvantaged students

A disadvantaged student is any student who faces obstacles to effective access to the opportunities offered by the Erasmus+ programme. These obstacles may be economic, social, cultural, geographical or health-related. Access to opportunities may also be limited for students from migrant backgrounds, with disabilities or learning difficulties or for any other reason, including factors which may give rise to discrimination as defined by Article 21 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union.

In order to facilitate the mobility of all its students, the University ensures equal opportunities for all participants in accordance with the guidelines of the National Agency INDIRE.

Successful applicants from a disadvantaged background will receive an additional monthly allowance of EUR 250.00.

Disadvantaged students must identify with one of the following circumstances:

1. disadvantaged economic background;
2. a certified disability;
3. parents of children under the age of 18;



4. students in employment;
5. students who have lost at least one parent;
6. children of victims of terrorism or organised crime;
7. students with a migrant and refugee background or who come from national or ethnic minorities.

Requested documentation:

Requirements 3 to 7 must be certified by candidates through a self-declaration attached to their application. The form for the 'self-declaration for supplementary allowances' is available on the call webpage.

Requirements 1 and 2 will be verified **exclusively** by the International Mobility Office of the University of Trieste through the use of data **already uploaded** to the University's databases

Documentation submitted directly by students will not be considered.

In order to qualify for the **disadvantaged economic background** allowance, students must:

- enrol for the academic year 2026-2027 by **1st September 2026**. Deadlines shall be postponed exclusively for students who could not enrol due to UniTS regulations.
- **students with their permanent address in Italy** must have obtained their equivalent financial situation index (ISEE Università 2026) by **1st September 2026** following the instructions provided for in the 2026-2027 student fee notice.
- **students with their permanent address abroad** must have been awarded an ARDIS scholarship for the academic year 2026-2027.

The ISEE parameters will be defined by the Italian Ministry of University and Research (MUR).

Students who identify with more than one of the circumstances above are only eligible for one additional monthly allowance.

In the event of higher costs incurred for duly motivated special needs, additional financial support may be granted to applicants with a disability certificate already present in University databases. The instructions for requesting additional funding will be sent by email to interested parties upon publication of the relevant information by the National Agency INDIRE.

If the University of Trieste and the host university signed an Erasmus+ agreement, the disadvantaged background allowance will be funded by Italy's national Erasmus+ agency, INDIRE. In other cases, funding will be provided by ministerial funds. Please remember that ministerial funds are also subject to the requirements laid down in Article 1(1.3).

In the case of grants funded by the Italian Ministry, if a student returns from mobility without obtaining the required credits or without having carried out the planned activity, they will be required to repay the full disadvantaged background allowance received. This does not apply if the student can provide



documentation attesting to exceptional circumstances, which has been verified by the University as being in line with the relevant funding programme's regulations.

2.6 Additional contribution

All students participating in a double or joint degree programme are eligible for an additional contribution. This contribution is funded by the Ministry, regardless of the type of mobility funding (Erasmus+ or ministerial), and will only be paid if the following requirements are met:

- be enrolled within the standard duration of a UniTS degree programme or at most one year beyond it.
- obtaining at least 1 ECTS credit abroad during the mobility period.

In the event that a student returns from mobility without obtaining at least 1 ECTS, they will be required to repay the full additional contribution received. This does not apply if the student can provide documentation attesting to exceptional circumstances, which has been verified by the University as being in line with the relevant funding programme's regulations.

The monthly allowance is proportional to the length of the mobility period and varies in accordance with the following table:

ISEE UNIVERSITÀ 2026	AMOUNT
ISEE ≤ EUR 30,000	EUR 200.00
ISEE > EUR 30,000 and ≤ EUR 75,000	EUR 100.00
ISEE > EUR 75,000 (or no ISEE)	EUR 50.00

In order to qualify for the additional contribution, students must:

- enrol for the academic year 2026-2027 by **1st September 2026**. Deadlines shall be postponed exclusively for students who could not enrol due to UniTS regulations.
- **students with their permanent address in Italy** must have obtained their equivalent financial situation index (ISEE Università 2026) by **1st September 2026** following the instructions provided for in the 2026-2027 student fee notice.



- **students with their permanent address abroad** must have been awarded an ARDIS scholarship for the academic year 2026-2027.

Eligible candidates will be identified by the International Mobility Office of the University of Trieste through the use of data **uploaded** to the University's databases by 1st September 2026.

Documentation submitted directly by students will not be considered.

2.7 Payment of grant and additional allowances

Payment of the grant, additional contribution and the allowance for disadvantaged students is made in two instalments.

1. The first instalment is 70% of the total and is paid on departure;
2. The second instalment will be calculated on the basis of the final, confirmed duration of the mobility. The maximum duration is indicated in the financial agreement signed by the student.

2.8 Travel cost reimbursement

Travel costs shall be reimbursed in accordance with the provisions of the 2026 Erasmus+ Programme Guide.

In this case, reimbursement is calculated using the [distance calculator](#) and the reference distances below.

Example of calculation:

City of departure: Trieste

Destination city: Oslo

Distance according to the Distance Calculator: 1599.43 km

Distance between 500 and 1,999 km

Contribution: EUR 309.00 (round trip) – EUR 417.00 (green round trip)



Reimbursement for travel costs is determined on the basis of the distance between the place of departure and the place of destination (not on the total distance travelled). **Travel costs shall be reimbursed only once per mobility period and will be paid in one instalment.**

For the green transport allowance to apply, sustainable means of transport must be used for more than 50% of the whole journey distance. The green transport allowance will be granted only upon presentation of supporting documentation (boarding passes, tickets, invoices, receipts, etc.).

If the University of Trieste and the host university signed an Erasmus+ agreement, the travel costs will be reimbursed by Italy's national Erasmus+ agency, INDIRE. In other cases, funding will be provided by ministerial funds. Please remember that ministerial funds are also subject to the requirements laid down in Article 1(1.3).

In the case of reimbursement paid by the Italian Ministry, if a student returns from mobility without obtaining the required credits or without having carried out the planned activity, they will be required to repay the full reimbursement. This does not apply if the student can provide documentation attesting to exceptional circumstances, which has been verified by the University as being in line with the relevant funding programme's regulations.

ARTICLE 3 – SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

Candidates must first read the call and the application instructions available on the relevant section of the call webpage.

Candidates must apply for the relevant call by logging in to the Esse3 online academic services. This is the only way to submit one's application and receive any contributions.

Candidates already selected by their department must still submit their application to receive any financial contributions.

Candidates already selected by their department who do not submit their application will not receive any financial contributions nor will they have Erasmus student status (where applicable).

For the application procedure to be considered complete, candidates must:

- fill in and upload the 'supplementary form' with the information necessary to evaluate their application;
- fill in and upload the 'self-declaration for additional allowance' form referred to in Article 2.5, if relevant;
- confirm their application in Esse3 online academic services.

The 'supplementary form' and the 'self-declaration for additional allowance' are available for download on the call web page.



3.1 Application period

From the publication of the call until 23rd March 2026 at 12:00.

During this period, candidates may submit applications for any mobility period:

- first term;
- second term;
- entire academic year.

Candidates are invited to complete the application procedure well before the deadline, in order to avoid any technical problems due to a system overload close to the deadline.

Assistance and support from the International Mobility Office will be provided **up to two working days before the deadline**. After that, no timely intervention can be ensured.

After the deadline, the relevant sections in Esse3 online academic services will automatically disappear and **it will not be possible to submit, edit or confirm any applications**.

Only applications which comply with the provisions of this article will be accepted.

ARTICLE 4 – SELECTION AND SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

This call may provide for three different selection methods according to the procedure adopted by the relevant department:

- **Selection through this call:** all available places are yet to be allocated. The selection of candidates takes place after the deadline for submission of applications.
- **Selected candidates:** all available places have already been allocated by the relevant department. Selected candidates must only submit their application to receive the financial contributions.
- **Mixed selection:** Some of the places have already been allocated by the relevant department. Selected candidates must only submit their application to receive the financial contributions. The remaining positions are yet to be allocated. The selection of candidates takes place after the deadline for submission of applications.

The selection method applying to a given double or joint degree is specified in the relevant sheet.

The rankings are published on the official University Notice Board and on the call webpage by **13th April 2026**.

The online publication of this list has legal value.



ARTICLE 5 – OBLIGATIONS OF SELECTED CANDIDATES

Successful candidates are considered to have automatically accepted their mobility.

Any refusals must be promptly notified and duly justified to outgoing.students@amm.units.it.

Candidates selected for more than one mobility programme for the same period must promptly communicate it and choose one of them.

If one of the successful candidates refuses their position, the International Mobility Office may contact other eligible candidates. Candidates selected for reallocations will have to confirm acceptance of the place according to the instructions and deadlines given by the International Mobility Office. Acceptance of students after reallocation is subject to the deadlines set by the host university. Students will be informed of their status as soon as possible.

Candidates not present on the official lists are invited to check their institutional email frequently, as acceptance deadlines may be given with little notice.

If the host institution requires a registration procedure and/or any additional documentation (e.g., language skill certificate), the selected candidate must meet all additional requirements within the deadlines set by the host institution, under penalty of exclusion. Candidates are responsible for verifying any requirements and obligations set by the host institution.

The allocation of a mobility period becomes effective upon acceptance by the host institution.

5.1 Further obligations for successful candidates

Successful candidates must read the additional obligations provided for in the Guidelines published on the call web page.

Participants who fail to submit the necessary documentation for the recognition of training activities and the payment of the financial contribution, and those who fail to fill in and submit the online questionnaire at the end of their mobility period may be required to reimburse the contribution received in full or in part.

ARTICLE 6 – INSURANCE COVERAGE

During their mobility period, students will be covered by health, civil liability and accident insurance.

- **Health insurance:** guaranteed by the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). For further information, please visit this [page](#) (mobility to EU countries). All recipients are invited to contact the local health authority (*azienda sanitaria locale* – ASL) to verify the health care in their destination country. Non-EU citizens will have to pay particular attention to entry and health insurance requirements.
- **Civil Liability:** the University of Trieste offers all enrolled students civil liability insurance through a policy signed by companies operating in the sector.



- **Insurance for accidents at work:** the University of Trieste offers insurance coverage for accidents at work through the national insurance system (consolidated law on the National Institute for Insurance against Accidents at Work [INAIL], Italian presidential decrees No 1124/65 and 156/99).

University insurance cover for accidents at work and civil liability only covers accidents which occur during study and internship activities. It does not cover any risks associated with the medical profession and the use of health facilities. Therefore, recipients who fall into this category must take out supplementary insurance at their own expense.

Candidates undertake to:

- constantly monitor the situation in their destination country so as to remain up to date about the health and safety provisions in force and to ensure that they comply with all resulting requirements, restrictions and the specific rules of the host institution;
- if necessary, they will take out additional health and/or travel insurance covering the risks related to health, travel or any incidents. The University will not be liable for any risks, inconveniences or exceptional or unexpected costs.
- carefully assess the safety conditions of their selected countries. For this purpose, candidates may consult the [website of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation](#) (in Italian).

ARTICLE 7 – ACCESS TO OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS, DATA PROCESSING AND STAFF MEMBER IN CHARGE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE

The personal data collected for the purposes of this selection will be processed in accordance with the Regulation (EU) No 2016/679 on the protection of personal data. Data may also be processed electronically.

Aggregate data may also be used for statistical purposes by the Italian Ministry of University and Research.

When necessary, personal data may be transferred to universities located in non-EU countries on the basis of adequacy decisions pursuant to Article 45 of the General Data Protection Regulation – Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2021/1773 of 28 June 2021.

Candidates are guaranteed access to the documents relating to the procedure. Terms and conditions of current legislation apply.

The data controller is the University of Trieste acting through its legal representative, the Rector.



The Head of the International Mobility Office of the University of Trieste is responsible for data processing.

Pursuant to Italian Law No 241/90 and subsequent amendments and additions, the staff member in charge of the administrative procedure is the Head of the International Mobility Office of the University of Trieste.

Updated information on Regulation (EU) 2016/679 is available on the [dedicated section](#) of the University website.

ARTICLE 8 – FINAL PROVISIONS

This call for applications and the list of selected and eligible candidates will be published on the [University Notice Board](#). The online publication has legal value.

For all communications and for the transmission of official documents between students and the University, both parties should only use the institutional email address assigned to them by the online academic services Esse3 when they first enrolled at the University. Requests and communications from private email addresses will not be considered.

Applicants are required to read the call, information, notices, instructions, forms and guidelines published and continuously updated on the call webpage, as well as the [University Regulation on International Mobility of Students](#) (in Italian).

The allocation of a mobility period becomes effective upon acceptance by the host institution.

The University will only pay Erasmus+ grants after receiving the relevant contributions from the National Agency INDIRE.

Eligibility for a mobility period does not automatically entitle a candidate to a mobility grant. Selected candidates who do not benefit from an Erasmus+ mobility grant can still go abroad with Erasmus student status. This will allow them to attend the same courses and benefit from the same facilities at the host institution as grant recipients.

Laws and regulations governing entry into specific countries are linked to the applicant's nationality. Applicants must inform themselves in good time about the requirements and documentation needed for entry and their stay for study purposes in the host country by contacting the relevant diplomatic representatives in Italy. Applicants are responsible for all procedures and costs related to entry visas and/or residence permits in the host country. In the case that an applicant is not issued a visa, the University is not liable, even after a grant has been awarded. It should be noted that in order to obtain a visa, some countries require proof of sufficient financial resources. The minimum amount may vary and may be higher than the grant for the mobility period itself. It should also be noted that the

procedures for issuing a visa can be expensive, complex and lengthy. It is therefore advisable to get all information well in advance.

For anything not specified in this call, please refer to current legislation, to the Regulation on international student mobility and to other provisions in force at the University of Trieste.

During the mobility period, students will not be able to take exams or complete any official degree-related activity at the University or any other institutions, unless established by the relevant mobility agreement or other regulations.
